What to report to the WA Police

The Police rely on reports from the community about where crime and suspicious activity are occurring.

Police patrols are most often targeted in line with reports from the public and the Police can only respond and assist where they are given reasonable detail about the nature and timing of an incident or ongoing issue.

Crime Stoppers 1800 333 000

Call Crime Stoppers or make an <u>online report</u> to provide information about any criminal activity and in some cases a reward may be issued. You can remain anonymous.

Crime Stoppers is staffed between 7am and 11pm weekdays and 8am to 8pm on weekends, but online reports can be made at any time.

For life-threatening or time critical emergencies, call 000

Hearing/speech impaired call TTY 106

Only use the 000/106 emergency service when an immediate response is required, to contact police while a crime is happening or if someone is in immediate danger.

Before you call 000 or (TTY) 106, decide which emergency service you need:

WA Police Force - Actively occurring criminal activity or an incident where there is an immediate threat to the lives of a person/people.

St John Ambulance - Emergencies requiring immediate medical treatment

Department of Fire and Emergency Services (**DFES**) - Fire, serious vehicle crash or severe weather event

For non-emergency situations that require WA Police Force assistance call 131 444 / TTY 106

These events non-emergency events include break in/theft that has already occurred, if you have witnessed, or are witnessing, a burglary or break-in taking place (the offender is still on the premises but you are not in immediate danger), property damage or reporting a sexual assault.

Reporting Graffiti Vandalism

The Shire has a number of actions in place to address graffiti vandalism in our Shire, but crime prevention is everyone's business and we all have a role to play. The Shire supports everyone to feel proud of their neighbourhood, and relies on your help to report and remove graffiti.

Graffiti incidents reported through the Goodbye Graffiti website are automatically directed to the relevant local government authority or asset owner to notify them of the incident and facilitate removal.

Graffiti on your property

Always endeavour to remove graffiti as quickly as possible. The prompt removal of graffiti helps defeat vandals as it diminishes the level of recognition and reward achieved by these offenders.

It is a good idea to take a photo of the graffiti vandalism for your records and police records - this will also assist if you have to lodge an insurance claim.

Graffiti on Council property

The Shire is responsible for removing graffiti from infrastructure managed or owned by Council such as road reserves, footpaths, street furniture, sculptures, artworks and buildings.

Goodbye Graffiti

The Goodbye Graffiti website hosts a range of information to assist the community to manage graffiti vandalism. The website hosts an online <u>Graffiti Reporting Form.</u>

Benefits of reporting online include:

- Each graffiti report goes directly to the asset owner for removal
- Asset owners are advised of graffiti on day of receiving report, or at the latest on the next working day of receiving the report
- A police report is lodged when the victim of graffiti makes the report

• Photos can be attached to online reports pending further investigation.

Goodbye Graffiti Hotline: 1800 44 22 55

While the Online Graffiti Reporting Form is the preferred method for reporting graffiti, the Goodbye Graffiti Hotline is operational 24 hours a day and is available to community members who wish to report graffiti as a victim, report a graffiti offence in progress, or provide information about a graffiti offender.

Please note that Victim reports can be made via the Goodbye Graffiti website or the Hotline, however nonvictim reports can only be submitted online. A victim of graffiti is defined as: *An owner, occupant, company representative, or a person responsible for the property that can provide correct ownership details (family member, employee, caretaker, manager, landlord etc.).*

Neighbourhood Watch

Great neighbours make great neighbourhoods!



Neighbourhood Watch is a good way to start conversations in your community and build safe, strong, caring, connected and happy communities!

Participating in Neighbourhood Watch is as easy as:

- Getting to know and talking to your neighbours
- Spending time out and about in your community and becoming familiar with your local environment
- · Reporting any suspicious activity to Police
- Applying crime prevention strategies around your home or business
- Educating and sharing information with your neighbours about what they can do to prevent crime
- Staying informed of local issues by following WA Police Force on social media.

Many of us already observe activities in our streets, particularly when it seems out of place. However, many of us may feel reluctant to do anything about our suspicions because we are unsure of what to do or unsure if our neighbours would appreciate our becoming involved.

Through Neighbourhood Watch, many of these uncertainties can be overcome. Neighbourhood Watch is protection of your property and of your community through communication and cooperation with the people who live around you.

Neighbourhood Watch does not take the place of Police and does not require you to become involved



in or take direct actions against suspicious behaviour. It simply uses the power of community and common interest to improve community safety and assist your local Police in addressing crime in your area.

SJ Neighbourhood Watch group meet once a month at various locations around the Shire. Our next schedule of meetings will commence in February 2024. We will post dates in our future eWatch newsletters as soon as they are confirmed.

Creating a safer, connected and informed neighbourhood is a team effort.

1. Reach out

Get to know your neighbours. Use our Knock Knock cards to break the ice.

2. Get involved

Start a Neighbourhood Watch Network. Share information to raise awareness and knowledge in your neighbourhood.

3. Make a connection with your neighbours Talk to your neighbours, express interest in something they are doing. Discuss crime prevention strategies.

4. Be considerate of others

Respect your environment - initiate a community street clean-up. Look out for your neighbours.

5. Be generous

Share your over abundant garden. Encourage neighbours to share skills and resources.

6. Bring neighbours together

Get involved with your neighbours. Organise a street bbq or driveway dinner.

Register your party or event with WA Police

As the weather warms up, Aussie's love a good BBQ and get together. As a host, you have a duty-of-care for the safety and wellbeing of your guests.

While you want them to have a good time you also want to minimise the potential for harm to persons and property as a result of excessive alcohol consumption or gate crashers. You could be held partly or fully responsible for something that happens to one of your guests at your party.

You can register as late as the day of the party/ event; however the registration form will accept a date up to a maximum of 28 days in advance.

Once you have submitted the online form your party/event will be registered with the Western Australia Police Force.

Please note: Registering your party with the WA Police does not mean that police will provide security for your party and that the capacity of police to undertake patrols of party venues or to visit a party venue in the event of trouble will



depend on other demands on resources at the time and the nature of the event in question.

Should you encounter any problems at your event that require Police attendance please call 131 444.

Rural Crime Prevention -Part One

Over the next few editions of eWatch, we will share with you some strategies for protecting your rural property from crime.

Part one is discussing how you can 'design out crime' when planning, building or renovating your property.

Research indicates that opportunity and visibility are key factors for thieves. If thieves believe they can get into and out of your property easily and without being seen, your property is at higher risk.

- Consider visibility when designing and erecting new buildings, sheds or stockyards. (Ideally these should be in sight of a farm house).
- Prevent accessibility to your property. Gates should be as strong as possible, mounted securely to strong corner posts. Secure gates with heavy duty chains and locks.
- If possible, use heavy duty rollers or metal gates at the entrance to sheds and any outbuildings.
- Consider the installation of movement sensor cameras or closed circuit television (CCTV) if



practical. This can assist in the successful identification and prosecution of offenders

Whilst not a guaranteed or standalone security measures, these strategies look at ways in which you can prevent would-be thieves from targeting your property in the first instance.

Holiday Watch Patrol Service

The Shire's FREE Holiday Watch Patrol Service allows SJ residents heading out of town during holiday breaks to register their properties to be checked regularly by Rangers while they are away.

Designed to increase community safety, Ranger checkups will consist of a simple drive-by to evaluate the property. Rangers will NOT access properties during check-ups.

If anything appears suspicious during the check-up or differs from the description the homeowner provides when registering their property, Rangers will contact the homeowner's nominated emergency contact or keyholder.

Rangers will aim to patrol each property once within every 24 to 48 hours.

This free service is not a substitute for appropriate security measures and the Shire will not be responsible for any loss or damage to properties using this service.

Home Security Tips for the Holidays

You can incorporate safety measures around the home, to help reduce opportunistic crime:

- Lock all doors and windows, including internal garage doors and roller doors, sheds, garages and gates
- Don't hide spare keys outside, leave them with a trusted friend, family member or neighbour
- Have a trusted family member or friend check your mail and put out/in your bins while you're away
- Get to know your neighbours. Neighbours are in the best position to identify anything suspicious in the street, so keep an eye out for each other and report anything suspicious to police.
- Ensure your home is well lit and clear of obstructions such as shrubs
- Do not post about your holiday before or during your trip on social media—save it for when you're home! Would be crooks don't need to know your home is unattended.

Fire Danger Ratings, Alerts and Warnings

Western Australia is joining with other States and Territories to deliver nationally consistent emergency information through the Australian Warning System (AWS).

The warning level icons and colours change to reflect the increasing risk to life or property, and the action you need to keep yourself and your loved ones safe.

Thee following warning levels will be applied across all relevant hazards:

To see the current alerts and warnings go to the Emergency WA Website

Advice	A fire has started but there is no immediate threat to lives or homes.	Be aware and keep up to date.
	There is a possible threat to lives or homes.	You need to leave or get ready to defend – do not wait and see.
Emergency Warning	There is a threat to lives or homes.	You are in danger and need to take immediate action to survive.



The Serpentine Jarrahdale Shire has areas included in both the Lower West Coastal and Lower West Inland regions. These regions *may have different fire ratings on the same day,* so it is important to know which you live in. You can find this information, as well as the current fire danger ratings online at the <u>emergency.wa.gov.au</u> website.

When the Fire Danger Rating is High, Extreme or Catastrophic:

- Permits are automatically suspended.
- Burning (including 1m3 garden refuse) is not allowed.
- You cannot use any BBQ or cooker in the open air that requires solid fuel (wood or charcoal). This includes wood fired ovens or stoves
- Campfires are not allowed.
