Community Cabinet gives WA State Government the opportunity to hold its regular meeting outside the Perth CBD – giving those communities the chance to discuss the issues and concerns on their doorstep.

With a State election just months away, [Rob Coales - President Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale](#) and CEO Paul Martin presented to Cabinet on the Shire's key advocacy projects.

It was also an opportunity for Minister for Sport and Recreation [David Templeman MLA](#) to sign a \$18.5 million State Government funding agreement with the Shire for one of those projects - Keirnar Park Recreation Precinct.



The funding is on top of the \$3.5 million the Shire has already received for the major infrastructure project.

Inset: A thumbs up for the new Byford Pump track.</p> <p>Byford is pumped</p> <p>• By Mal Doo</p> <p>It's looking increasingly likely that Byford will have its promised pump track and jump line by August next year.</p> <p>At last week's special council meeting, councillors unanimously approved Margaret River-based Common Ground Trails to take on the design and construction of the project at Briggs Park.</p> <p>Common Ground has designed about 150 pump tracks around Australia, and also in Canada. IBI company director David Wilcox said this one will be the largest asphalt-surfaced combined pump track and jump line facility they have ever built.</p> <p>He's confident the work will be completed on time, and construction is planned to start in the first half of next year after a period of community feedback.</p> <p>Common Ground's Brian Lawlor said the pump track will be designed to accommodate a range of wheel sizes, and will be accessible to younger riders.</p> <p>While the jump line, with jumps up to two metres high, will cater to the more adventurous.</p> <p>He also said the asphalt will have a 20-year life expectancy, and that maintenance of the track will be fairly straightforward because asphalt is a product most local government work crews are already familiar with.</p> <p>There is hope the new facility will entice riders away from using (and damaging) the BMX track.</p> <p>The \$865,530 outlay for the design and construction will also include park shelters and furniture, drainage, and landscape works.</p> <p>The shire is currently negotiating extras including a carpark, lighting of the carpark and pump track, CCTV, and connectivity to the existing pavilion.</p> <p>Improvements to the existing pavilion will be done as part of the Briggs Park Pavilion Youth Centre Upgrade project.</p> <p>The pump track has been made possible due to a reallocation of the \$1.34 million nature splash park funding via the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.</p> <p>Sports Minister David Templeman was at Briggs Park, following this week's Community Cabinet.</p> <p>The self-proclaimed "most successful sports minister since the last one" was excited to see a homegrown entity win the contract and said he looked forward to seeing the finished product.</p> <p>The minister was also on hand to sign a new \$18.5 million funding agreement between DLGSC and the shire for the Keirnan Park Recreation Project – which he did so with an idiosyncratically dramatic flourish, while chiding local member Hugh Jones and Shire President Rob Coates for their paltry scrawl.</p> <p>"We're making history – you've got to give them something to remember," he said.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">CONTINUED PAGE 3</p>

A LOCAL PERSPECTIVE ON THE HOUSING CRISIS

The housing crisis is a headline issue across the country, with all levels of government and private industry looking to play their part in finding solutions to get more people into a home that meets their needs.

While State and Federal Governments have a pivotal role in setting housing policy and assisting with delivery of social and affordable housing, the role of local government in the space can be varied.

A recent report by the Royal Commission into Defence and Veterans' Affairs, the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) advised: Addressing the Housing Crisis: Addressing Local Government's Contribution, asserts that local governments are at the forefront of the housing crisis.

The report outlines local government's role in housing development and addressing the housing challenges, including through bank infrastructure such as water and sewerage treatment, roads and footpaths, and other infrastructure.

Local governments are also responsible for addressing housing development, including infrastructure, delivery, marketing, construction and sale, and require coordination to accelerate housing supply at the scale envisioned.

One of the primary recommendations in the report is the need for formal agreements and reciprocal relationships to address the challenges of local government, including of National Cabinet and the National Housing and Infrastructure Partnership Council.

According to the report, local government also faces financial policy and investment decisions in relation to housing, including through planning and development contributions. Other recommendations include the need for local government to work with other stakeholders on such planning and development contributions, including through formal agreements for local government for infrastructure funding, partnering to respond to the challenges of community-wide housing and working together to progress solutions to deliver housing and unaccommodated housing.

Leading in Serpentine Jarrahdale

Shire President of the Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale, Elinor Chisholm, agrees that local government plays a crucial role in addressing Australia's housing crisis, and this role takes a collaborative approach to the challenge.

“Local government is key in several important areas,” Mr Coales said. “First, it ensures that we provide a smooth, efficient service for planning and engineering approvals.”

“It also highlights the importance of us all to take planning, framework, and efficient approval processes, and ensure that they are early and transparent, including cost sharing.”

“We’re responsible for making sure that local infrastructure is delivered, built and transparently, including cost sharing.”

“We foster a culture across the organisation that focuses on achieving real results, and finding practical solutions to any challenges that arise.”

Awards for Excellence, where the Shire was the inaugural Local Government Authority of the Year award.

Mr Coales agrees that the biggest challenge in meeting the needs of a growing community, as outlined in the ALGA report, is ensuring the right enabling infrastructure is in place.

“The ALGA AW’s recent Growth Asset Infrastructure Strategy Report highlighted that an initial investment of \$42 million in enabling infrastructure is needed to address land for development, delivering better in three key growth areas of Perth and Peel and metropolitan areas of Perth and Peel.”

Mr Coales said:

“I also can’t stress enough how important it is to support community growth. It’s not just about opening land for housing. It’s about welcoming the housing we plan to build, and the people who will be moving into it. The Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale is committed to providing a high-quality, affordable housing solution for our community, and we’re proud to be part of the solution.”

“We’re grateful for the support from government and other partners that we’ve received on our journey so far.”

“One of those areas is around Perth, where there is a need to upgrade infrastructure, such as roads, sewerage, and the public transport system.”
