The Serpentine Jarrahdale Network is a network of schools based in the Shire, consisting of:

- **Byford Primary School** •
- Byford Secondary College •
- Jarrahdale Primary School .
- Marri Grove Primary School •
- Mundijong Primary School •
- Serpentine Primary School •
- West Byford Primary School •
- Woodland Grove Primary School

The Serpentine Jarrahdale Network presented to Elected Members at a Policy Concept Forum on Monday, 22 July 2024 to provide an overview of their network and the Lighthouse Project, based on a Multi Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) network approach. The proposal is that the MTSS would support students' social, emotional, academic and behavioural needs from a strengths-based perspective and provide support for interconnected interventions.

The model, based on a two year pilot program, would require \$845,000 for staffing, resources and professional development.

- Build staff capacity that is sustained in our network of schools
- Build connected practice with tiered approaches
- Lighthouse network sustainable model of excellence for other networks

In the presentation, the Serpentine Jarrahdale Network identified that the Shire could assist them with progressing the initiative through partnerships and grants.
